

# Arthur's™ World

September 27, 2019 – January 5, 2020



Jump into your favorite Arthur Scenes with the Chroma Key wall

Get ready to jump into the wonderful world of *Arthur*™ this fall at The Museum! Explore Mr. Ratburn's Classroom, the Elwood City Library, the Read Family Kitchen, and more! Even dance in front of a Chroma Key wall that inserts visitors into favorite *Arthur* TV scenes. *Arthur's World* is designed to reinforce the messages behind the *Arthur* book character and television series — *that being smart and into books is cool, and that kids face, and can resolve, real-life dilemmas.*

Created by Marc Brown, *Arthur*, along with his little sister D.W. and their friends and family, has been beloved by children since 1976. Today there are dozens of *Arthur* titles and more than 65 million books in print, and the *Arthur* television program airs daily on PBS. Featuring stories about the challenges of childhood (such as looking and feeling different, sibling rivalry, taking care of a pet, or making new friends), *Arthur* illustrates problem-solving and communication skills, as well as the importance of self-respect and respect for others. In its 22<sup>nd</sup> season, the Emmy-winning *Arthur* television series is the longest running children's animated television series.

If I told you there is a character who stars in a television show that debuted in 1996, is still running strong today, and has already been renewed through 2021, could you name him? If I gave you a hint that he might be a cartoon anthropomorphic aardvark, would that help? Yes, I'm referring to Arthur Read, from the longest running children's animated series in the United States, *Arthur*<sup>TM</sup>, which airs on PBS.

As we've done with similarly loved characters like *Curious George*<sup>®</sup>, *Thomas the Tank Engine*<sup>TM</sup>, and *Clifford the Big Red Dog*<sup>TM</sup>, Arthur comes to The Museum this fall in his very own exhibition, *Arthur's*<sup>TM</sup> *World*, created by the Boston Children's Museum. In this immersive experience for kids and their adults, visitors literally step into an episode of Arthur and visit Mr. Ratburn's classroom, have a backyard sleepover with Arthur and his friends, and even visit the Elwood City Library, one of Arthur's favorite hangouts! This feature will be especially highlighted here in Reading as we've partnered with the Berks County Libraries to help promote the exhibition and incorporate literacy-based learning activities into the fun both here at The Museum and at library branches near you. The support for this partnership comes from the JerLyn Foundation and gives families across Berks County and beyond the chance to play, learn, and read with one of television's most beloved characters.

In addition to this "small screen" exhibition, this fall also gives our visitors an experience beyond the "silver screen" as we present *CUT! Costume and the Cinema*, an exhibition of actual Hollywood costumes worn by some of the biggest stars of today's cinema. Movies like *Pirates of the Caribbean*, *Phantom of the Opera*, and *Sherlock Holmes* are all represented. Guests can get up close to outfits worn by Keira Knightley, Johnny Depp, Daniel Craig, Amy Adams, and Scarlett Johansson to name just a few. Each of these costumes is from an award-winning film and when displayed together tells a story of fashion and design across 400 years through the lens of some of our favorite films and actors.

As the weather begins to turn this fall, and winter approaches, The Museum will be the place to be for families to gather. Even though it's only September, it is never too early to begin thinking about Christmas!
